




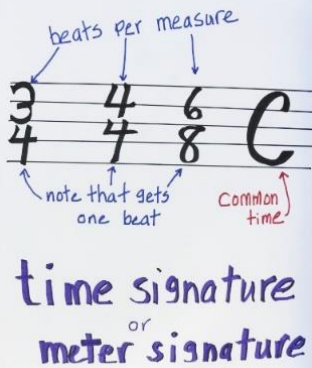
		<p>Steady pulse that measures music</p>
		<p>Pattern of the sounds measured through time.</p>
		<p>Pitch with rhythm, the main part that is sung</p>
		<p>Symbol representing one sound lasting for one beat</p>

 <p>eighth note (quaver)</p>		<p>Symbol representing one sound lasting for half of a beat.</p>
 <p>Staff (staves)</p>		<p>Lines that musical notes are written on.</p>
 <p>measure or bar</p> <p>measure lines or bar lines</p>		<p>A line divides the beats of the music into groups according to their meter.</p>
 <p>G clef</p>		<p>A fancy letter G that tells where that pitch is located in the staff.</p>



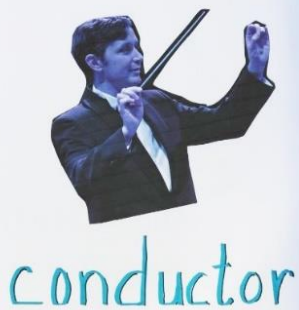
A fancy letter F that indicates where the pitch F is located on the staff.



The indication of how many beats are in each measure of the song.



A symbol representing silence in a song.



The person who keeps time for an ensemble and cues entrances.



maestro
(maestra)

A music teacher, a conductor is often called this as well.

Symphony

A group a musicians playing together.

A mathematical echo of a sound wave.



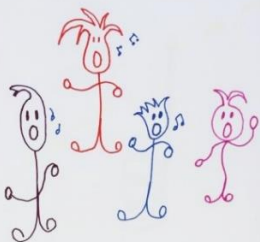
segno

A fancy letter S, it is used as a sign, part of a 'road map' in music.







cadenza

A solo within an orchestra song.

 <p>chord</p>	<p>Three or more notes played at the same time</p>
 <p>concerto</p>	<p>A song for a solo instrument with an orchestra playing the accompaniment</p>
 <p>consonance</p>	<p>Music that is stable and happy sounding.</p>
 <p>dissonance</p>	<p>Music that is unstable and tense.</p>



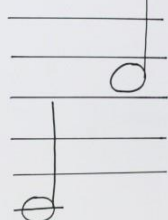
drone

A single note that goes on and on during a song.



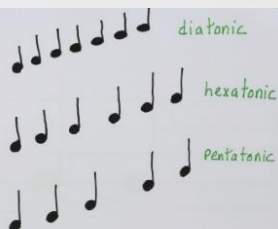
interval

Two notes played at the same time or one after the other.







octave




An interval of an 8th, two notes with the same letter name.



scale

A set of notes used in a song. (Diatonic Scale, Blues Scale, Pentatonic Scale etc,)

 <p>tie (ligature)</p>	<p>When two notes of the same pitch are connected, we smoosh their sound together.</p>
 <p>slur (ligature)</p>	<p>When two notes of different pitch are connected, we connect them as much as possible.</p>
 <p>quartet</p>	<p>Group of four performers</p>
 <p>ensemble</p>	<p>Group of performers of any size</p>

 <p>recital</p>	<p>Musical performance</p>
 <p>tempo</p>	<p>Speed of the music</p>
 <p>unison</p>	<p>All singing/playing the same notes and rhythm</p>
 <p>andante</p>	<p>Tempo, a medium walking speed</p>



allegro

Tempo, a fast speed



adagio

Tempo, a slow speed



largo

Tempo: very very slow.



vivace

Tempo: Super fast

dynamics



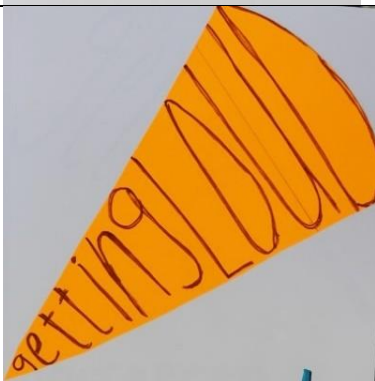
forte

Dynamic: quiet



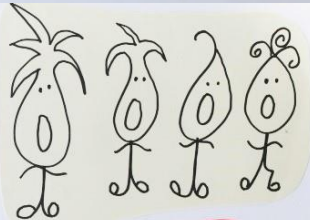
crescendo

Getting quieter...

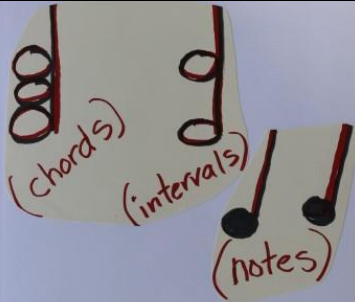
decrescendo

harmony

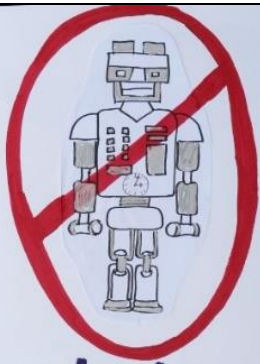
Partner pitches and sounds that support the melody



treble

High pitched sounds

 <p>bass</p>	<p>Low pitched sounds</p>
 <p>timbre</p>	<p>Character or color of the sound.</p>
 <p>verse</p>	<p>Part of the song that is repeated, but has different words.</p>
 <p>refrain</p>	<p>Part of the song that is repeated, but words stay the same.</p>



rubato

Raggedy time, the tempo gets sped up and slowed down.



imProVise

Make up the music spontaneously



waltz

Dance/song in triple meter, three beats per measure.



gigue

Dance/song with two beats per measure.
